

Addendum to the Master Agreement 2008–2009

Dear Member:

This recent round of negotiations resulted in a successful agreement that was approved by vote of our membership on March 3, 2008. We were able to reach a short-term agreement that will provide us stability throughout the approaching levy process.

With more than fifty representatives, we had the largest CEA bargaining team in our history. Still, they worked well together during communications trainings and critical discussion forums. They readily assumed responsibility for their key role in the process. A response was formulated and completed swiftly. This allowed us the opportunity to secure a contract extension.

This agreement has bought some limited time. This addendum represents a period of security for the approaching months. During this time, we intend to keep the current bargaining team intact and continue more extensive training in communications that will provide a needed, additional link to our membership.

More than one-half of our team were firsttime members and represented the diversity and the wide range of teaching experiences existing across the district. Their names can be found on page 2 of this addendum.

I would like to thank all of the members who participated in the negotiations process.

Article 902 Teacher Salary Schedules

902.11 Effective August 25, 2008, Teachers and School Nurses possessing a valid School Nurse certificate, shall be paid in accordance with the following:

902.12 Teachers and School Nurses with a minimum of nineteen (19) and less than twenty-three (23) years of teaching experience, as credited by the Columbus City Schools for salary purposes, shall have One thousand four-hundred forty-four dollars (\$1,444) added to the salary provided in 902.11 above.

902.13 Teachers and School Nurses with a minimum of twenty-three (23) and less than twenty-seven (27) years of teaching experience, as credited by the Columbus Public Schools for salary purposes, shall have Three thousand six-hundred sixty dollars

(\$3,660) added to the salary provided in 902.11 above.

- 902.14 Teachers and School Nurses with twenty-seven (27) and less than thirty (30) years of teaching experience, as credited by the Columbus Public Schools for salary purposes, shall have Six thousand seven-hundred twenty-three dollars (\$6,723) added to the salary provided in 902.11 above.
- 902.15 Teachers and School Nurses with thirty (30) or more years of teaching experience, as credited by the Columbus Public Schools for salary purposes, shall have Nine thousand nine hundred twenty-eight dollars (\$9,928) added to the salary provided in 902.11 above.
- 902.16 Teachers and School Nurses with fifteen (15) or more years of teaching experience, as credited by the Columbus Public Schools for salary purposes, and who are in the Master's Degree, Master's Degree Plus 30 semester hours, or Ph.D. track shall have Two hundred dollars (\$200) added to the salary provided in 902.11 above.

Article 903 Supplemental Hourly Rate

Except as provided elsewhere in this Agreement for specific supplemental services, effective August 25, 2008, the rate of pay for Board-authorized supplemental services provided by members of the bargaining unit shall be \$29.50 per hour.

Article 904

Full-Time Hourly Professional Employees

904.01 During the term of this Agreement, full-time hourly professional employees (other than "tutors" who are governed by Chapter 1000) shall be paid in accordance with the following: ("Full-time" is a minimum of six (6) hours per day on a regular basis.)

By majority vote of full-time teachers assigned to a building, with the concurrence of the building principal, the date(s) and schedule for Parent-Teacher Conferences may deviate from this schedule (with an equal total amount of time). If so, all teachers in that building must comply with selected schedule and date(s). Once the schedule has been determined, that practice shall continue until changed by majority vote with concurrence of the principal.

*Schools will close 1/2 hour early. Members of the bargaining unit assigned to school buildings shall be permitted to leave immediately following pupil dismissal. All other members of the bargaining unit shall be dismissed one hour early. Early dismissal shall not be a reason for reduction in compensation.

NOTE: August 25 and August 26 shall be used for staff meetings and preparation for the initiation of the new school year and the new semester. October 17 is set aside as a day when each school principal and staff may plan for a staff development activity. Staff members would have an opportunity to plan, confer, consult or interact as a means of establishing an improved school atmosphere. Individual staff members are free, however, to attend the Capital Day rather than their own school staff function if they so choose. In schools where no staff development program is planned, the individual staff member must choose to participate in a staff development activity at the local building or some other designated place, approved by the principal, or to attend the Capital Day.

Article 1503 Duration of Agreement

This Agreement supersedes the Agreement which expired on August 24, 2008, and any amendments to such Agreement. This Agreement shall become effective at 12:01 a.m. on the day after it has been approved by action of the Board of Education, and shall continue in full force and effect until midnight, August 30, 2009. The terms of this Agreement are prospective only, except for salary and wage increases, which shall become effective as specified in particular Articles and Sections.
